#### Five CAAANDO Policies

that CAAANDO members support for the Ashby BART neighborhood

### 1) Foster a distinctive, attractive neighborhood with a strong sense of place:

- a. Preserve and build upon successful existing uses that promote a strong sense of place (for example- Flea Market, Adeline/Alcatraz commercial area, Berkeley Bowl, Ashby Arts District, etc);
- b. Define the neighborhood with visual cues;
- c. Plant trees throughout the neighborhood and preserve existing trees whenever feasible;
- d. Create active and secure open spaces;
- e. Create opportunities for community interaction.

### 2) Create a safe and walkable neighborhood:

- a. Provide street and sidewalk improvements that ensure safety and promote convenience for pedestrians, wheelchairs-users, and bicyclists;
- b. Provide traffic calming devices that encourage driving at posted speed limits (Autos regularly exceed 40mph on Ashby, Adeline, Alcatraz, and MLK);
- c. Require building design that promotes sidewalk activity for commercial zones (this helps business and slows traffic);
- d. Orient development to provide "eyes on the street" to increase public safety.

## 3) Create a diverse range of housing types and commercial opportunities and choices;

- Develop non-profit affordable housing using the Housing Trust Fund and lowincome housing tax credits similar to recent projects approved by Housing Advisory Commission and City Council;
- b. Develop market rate housing to be competitively bid by for–profit developers (Recent market rate developers seem to be emphasizing for-sale condominiums).
- c. Promote commercial and mixed-use components through Section 108 loans or other incentives.

# 4) Develop public open space that serves community needs

a. Accommodate large community events like Juneteenth celebration and Flea Market:

#### 5) Enhance public transit usage and choice

- a. Increase housing supply in neighborhood;
- b. Increase transit connectivity with commercial areas;
- c. Support residential parking reductions through measures such as car-sharing, transit kiosks, demand management, etc.;
- d. Improve transit interconnectivity and convenience (BART to bus, shuttle, paratransit)
